PROPERTY MARKING - By Norfolk Constabulary

With the passing of Christmas most households will have gained some very sought after valuable property be it a games console, TV, bike etc. It is important we do not advertise these items to thieves in the first place to aid with crime prevention.

For added security, valuable property should be marked up. This makes property not as desirable to thieves as it presents a greater risk for potential purchasers if they are caught in possession of it. If you have marked your property it also greatly increases the chance of you getting it back should we recover it.

There are many ways to mark your property. Please find below a few options:

Electronic marking - You can create a free private and secure portfolio of all your personal property at the Immobilise website at www.immobilise.com. It only takes a few minutes online to register your property details and it enables the police forces across the United Kingdom to identify the owner of lost and stolen goods.

UV pen marking - Using a UV pen, which is invisible to the naked eye, you can mark your postcode followed by the house number or name on your chosen property. You can deter potential thieves by using stickers, usually supplied with the pen, indicating that your property is marked. The UV mark is only visible with special UV lights and we can use these when property is recovered. Remember that UV markings need to be re-applied from time to time as they fade with wear and tear.

Photography - Taking detailed photographs of property can help you to prove it is rightfully yours and can also help us to prosecute thieves.
